PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE—CLAUDETTE RAINEY





CHURCH WOMEN UNITED 2019 World Community Day



THE TIME IS NOW to reach out, embrace and walk side by side with the persecuted. Atlanta Unit's program on Friday November 1, was attended by a multicultural group of people. We hosted the DeKalb Unit and presented our first Lifetime Achievement Awards to Margaret Koehler and Lola Parks, in abstentia. Kudos to Mrs. Helen Sprewer, Rev. Angela Rice and other CWU members who helped to bring us this timely program.

The messenger Plemon T. El-Amin, who replaced Rev. McDonald, was well traveled, versatile and a man of God. Karen Jones, sitting in the audience was moved by his oratory and many quotes from Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. She became a student. "One thing that stood out for me is that followers of every religion believe in what they believe and believe it, to be right and true. Plemon T. El-Amin is the Imam Emeritus of the Atlanta Masjid of Al-Islam, one of the largest and most progressive Mosques in the United States. He is the former Director of the Clara Mohammed Elementary School and W. Deen Mohammed School of Atlanta. Working as a close aide and supporter of Imam Warith Deen Mohammed, Imam El-Amin has traveled the nation and the world, representing the concerns and interests

of Muslim Americans and Interfaith adherents in such places as Palestine, Sudan, Saudi Arabia, Israel, Syria, Jordan, Denmark, England, Spain, Egypt, Turkey, Malaysia and South Africa. Imam Plemon El-Amin serves on various religious and civic councils, including the Boards of the Faith Alliance of Metro Atlanta, the Atlanta Majlis Ash Shura, Atlanta Interfaith Broadcasters, Interfaith Communities Initiative, Georgia Piedmont Technical College, and the Atlanta Fulton County Recreation Authority. As part of the World Pilgrims, he has led 27 Pilgrimages with over 500 Muslims, Christians and Jews through the religious and cultural landscapes of Turkey, Morocco and Spain, Jerusalem and Palestine, Istanbul, Athens and the Greek Isles, and Jordan-to deepen their intimate personal friendships and working relationships with one another. He performed the greater Pilgrimage (Hajj) to Mecca in 1978 and in 2006, and has enjoyed 5 minor pilgrimages (Umra). Imam Plemon is a native Atlantan, with a degree from Harvard University. He is married to Cassandra Scott El-Amin.



November 1 - LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT HONOREES



Margaret G Koehler has a long history of involvement with Church Women United, an ecumenical movement including women of protestant, catholic, and Orthodox affiliations. In this movement she served as a professional volunteer in various positions of leadership, including president of Church Women United in Atlanta and president of Church Women United in Georgia. She was honored as a "Valiant Woman" by Church Women United in Atlanta and by Church Women United in Georgia, and as Georgia's CWU Church Woman of the Year in 1989.

In 1989 Margaret was one of ten delegates chosen to represent Church Women United USA at the *Decade Festival* celebrating the close of

the *Decade of Churches in Solidarity with Women, sponsored by the World Council of Churches* and held in Harare, Zimbabwe. The assignment also included a week (prior to the Festival) in a Woman-to-Woman visitation program in South Africa. Following the Decade Festival, she was a press representative at the World Council of Churches Assembly, also held in Zimbabwe.

Margaret's avocations include vocal engagements and free-lance writing. Her hobbies and interests through the years have included reading, drama, music, sewing, crafting, gardening, and travel. Her scriptural reference for life is Micah 6:8 "What does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God." Her favorite expression is "To God be the Glory."

Margaret has given unselfishly of her time and talents to serve with the Church Women United ecumenical movement.



Lola E Parks is known as "Everybody's Volunteer". She has served with numerous non-profits and other organizations throughout her life. Church Women United Atlanta is one of the recipients of her unselfish and tireless service. Lola was honored with the "Valiant Woman" award in 1991. She has been a program participant in numerous programs over the years for CWU, Atlanta. She has served as the Treasurer of the Unit and

has been the "Official Musician" for the Atlanta Unit.

Some of her many other volunteer activities: Life Member, Salvation Army Women's Auxiliary (Chaplain and tutor), Atlanta Convention and Visitors Bureau at the Airport Visitor Center, tutor for at the Fulton County Juvenile Detention School, Life Member Clark Atlanta University Alumni Association, Emory School of Nursing Auxiliary, Life Member of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Cancer Home Auxiliary, Life Member National Council of Negro Women.

She has received numerous honors and awards for volunteer service including President Barack Obama. Her most recent awards in 2019 – The Black College Fund and the North Georgia Conference United Methodist Women's Doris Paul Purpose Award. Lola is not getting tired, just getting better with service to others.
