- Mental Health-The 2024 theme. Where to start: Mental Health in a Changing World alerts us that for better or worse the world is constantly changing and it can be overwhelming to deal with everything going on around us. By state the age varies between 18 and 21. Most children are reunited with their parents or other family members but in Georgia 11,000 children are currently in foster care. Let's do our part as CWU members to seek policies that improves the lives of all children but also advocate for more and better support of children in foster care, foster care parents and staff at Georgia Department of Family Children Services (DFCS).
